House Judiciary Committee: Markup of H.R. 2299 (CIANA)

On March 27, 2012, the House Judiciary Committee (Chairman Rep. Lamar Smith, R-TX) marked up H.R. 2299, the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act (CIANA). Fourteen hostile amendments were offered. All were rejected, one by voice vote, the remainder by roll call votes. Thereafter H.R. 2299 was approved, 20-yes, 13-no.

CIANA has two main sections. The first ("Transportation of Minors in Circumvention of Certain Laws Relating to Abortion") makes it a federal crime to transport a minor girl across state lines to obtain an abortion with the intent of circumventing the parental involvement law of the girl's home state. The second ("Child Interstate Abortion Notification") requires an abortion provider in a state without a parental involvement law to provide 24 hour notice to a parent or legal guardian before performing an abortion on a girl who is a resident of a different state.

Description of Votes

<u>Vote 1</u>: Nadler Amendment #1 would create an exception for a grandparent or adult sibling. The amendment failed, 7-Yes, 16-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 2</u>: Scott Amendment #2 would create an exception for a sibling. The amendment failed by voice vote.

<u>Vote 3</u>: Scott Amendment #3 would create an exception for taxicab drivers, bus drivers, or others in business of professional transport. The amendment failed, 10-yes, 14-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 4</u>: Watt Amendment #6 would create an exception for health in first main section. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 13-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 5</u>: Watt Amendment #7 would create an exception for health in the second main section. The amendment failed, 12-yes, 15-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 6</u>: Jackson-Lee Amendment #4 would create an exception for clergy, godparents, aunts, uncles, or first cousins. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 16-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 7</u>: Jackson-Lee Amendment #10 would create exceptions based on pregnancy being the result of sexual contact with various persons. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 17-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 8</u>: Jackson-Lee Amendment #15 would substitute 120 for 45 for days after enactment when act would take effect. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 17-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 9</u>: Johnson Amendment #8 would create an exception related to physical safety of minor. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 18-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 10</u>: Quigley Amendment #11 would create exceptions if the minor's pregnancy was the result of rape or incest. The amendment failed, 11-yes, 15-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 11</u>: Chu Amendment #9 would strike "save the life" exception language and substitute "protect the life and health." The amendment failed, 9-yes, 15-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 12</u>: Nadler Amendment #12 would create exceptions to prosecution or civil suits based on beliefs about the judicial bypass procedure of the minor's State of residence. The amendment failed, 8-yes, 16-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

<u>Vote 13</u>: Scott Amendment #13 (in block with Amendment #14) would create limitations on prosecution. The amendments failed, 14-yes, 17-no. "No" was a pro-life vote.

Vote 14: Final passage—H.R. 2299 was approved, 20-yes, 13-no. "Yes" was a pro-life vote.
